## **November General Meeting**

- Welcome and Call to Order was at 7:02pm, followed by Pledge of Allegiance and Moment of Silence.
- SHHS Principal Juan Villarreal
  - o Thanked the association for the Principal's Discretionary Fund fall donation. There were some funds left over, and they will be used to support the Spring sports.
  - o The first formative assessment was completed and results came in. SHHS reached 80% and if they continue this momentum, they could be a score of "B" in the final testing.
  - o Tardy policy is holding students accountable. Mr. V is also focusing on supporting the faculty and staff, so they can accomplish great things with the kids.
  - o Mr. V meets with all the student organizations' Presidents for their feedback. This is called his "President's Round Table." He shared one student's story and was able to encourage it into an ongoing mission of continuing to change the perception and culture of SHHS. Stepping up to the challenge, the ROTC President created a program for Veterans' Day to honor faculty and staff who had previously served in the military. The program went great, and it was extremely well-received. SHHS will share videos/photos online.
  - o Division 1 soccer player, Jose Ortiz, signed to play soccer at SMU. Congrats to Jose!
  - If there is a tradition that is no longer practiced at SHHS, please share it with us so Mr. V
    can see if there is a way to bring it back.
  - New marauee has been installed!
- SHHS Girls' Basketball Coach Bailey
  - o Thanked us for our help with last year's Tall Texan Tournament.
  - o This year's tournament (next week) is the largest, and she needs VOLUNTEERS! There will be 50 games in 3 days. Games will be in all the gyms. This is the last tournament under Coach Bailey's reign, as she will be retiring next school year. Help is needed at the gates, hospitality area, concessions.
  - Winner of tournament will be publicized and become Team of the Week on the Dallas'
     Wings social media.
- Laura Heymann announced that September Minutes were posted online. Nicia Dibben motioned to accept the minutes as posted; motion was seconded by Al Critz; motion approved.
- Jayme Thomas read September-October Treasurer's Report. Pat Graham motioned to accept the report as read; motion was seconded by Melody Rushing; motion approved.
  - There was a discussion over current budget, which was approved at August General Meeting. The board provided a breakdown of the "SHHS Support" category and fulfilled

ASAs for the year. Laura explained that the board was requesting to amend the line to \$9k instead of the current \$6k. There was an open discussion with attendees.

Pat Graham motioned to amend budget line item for SHHS Support category to \$9k;
 motion was seconded by Jody Graham; motion approved.

  - Annual Holiday Party was scheduled for December 11<sup>th</sup> at J. Gilligan's. There was open discussion about how this event should be moving forward.
  - Claudia Perkins motioned to cancel the association's Holiday Party and instead support the Christmas Around the World event at SHHS (scheduled for December 12<sup>th</sup>); motion seconded by Melody Rushing; motion approved.
